The City of St. Louis is awash in approximately 24,000 vacant parcels – 9,000 buildings and 15,000 vacant lots. Roughly 75% of these vacancies are situated in the region’s poorest urban neighborhoods. The links between vacant properties and deleterious effects for neighboring residents have been well-documented: vacant properties increase opportunities for crime, make residents feel less safe, and negatively impact the health of neighbors. Conversely, rehabilitation of vacant property presents opportunities for improving economic conditions and community health in low-income neighborhoods by creating affordable housing, stimulating private investment, and increasing quality of life for residents.

In 2018, with support from the City of St. Louis, Legal Services of Eastern Missouri created *Neighborhood Advocacy* to represent urban neighborhoods to use Missouri laws to acquire vacant and abandoned property for redevelopment in partnership with local developers. Using this model, we empower residents to transform their own communities by reducing abandoned property and creating new units of safe and affordable housing. Since its inception, *Neighborhood Advocacy* has represented over three dozen neighborhoods to acquire and redevelop vacant and abandoned properties. As of 2025, hundreds of cases have been opened on behalf of neighborhood clients, resulting in the revitalization of 727 formerly vacant housing units across the city and millions of dollars of private investment into formerly vacant units.

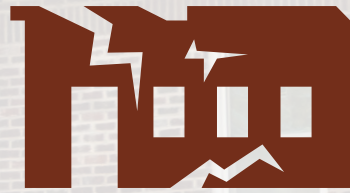

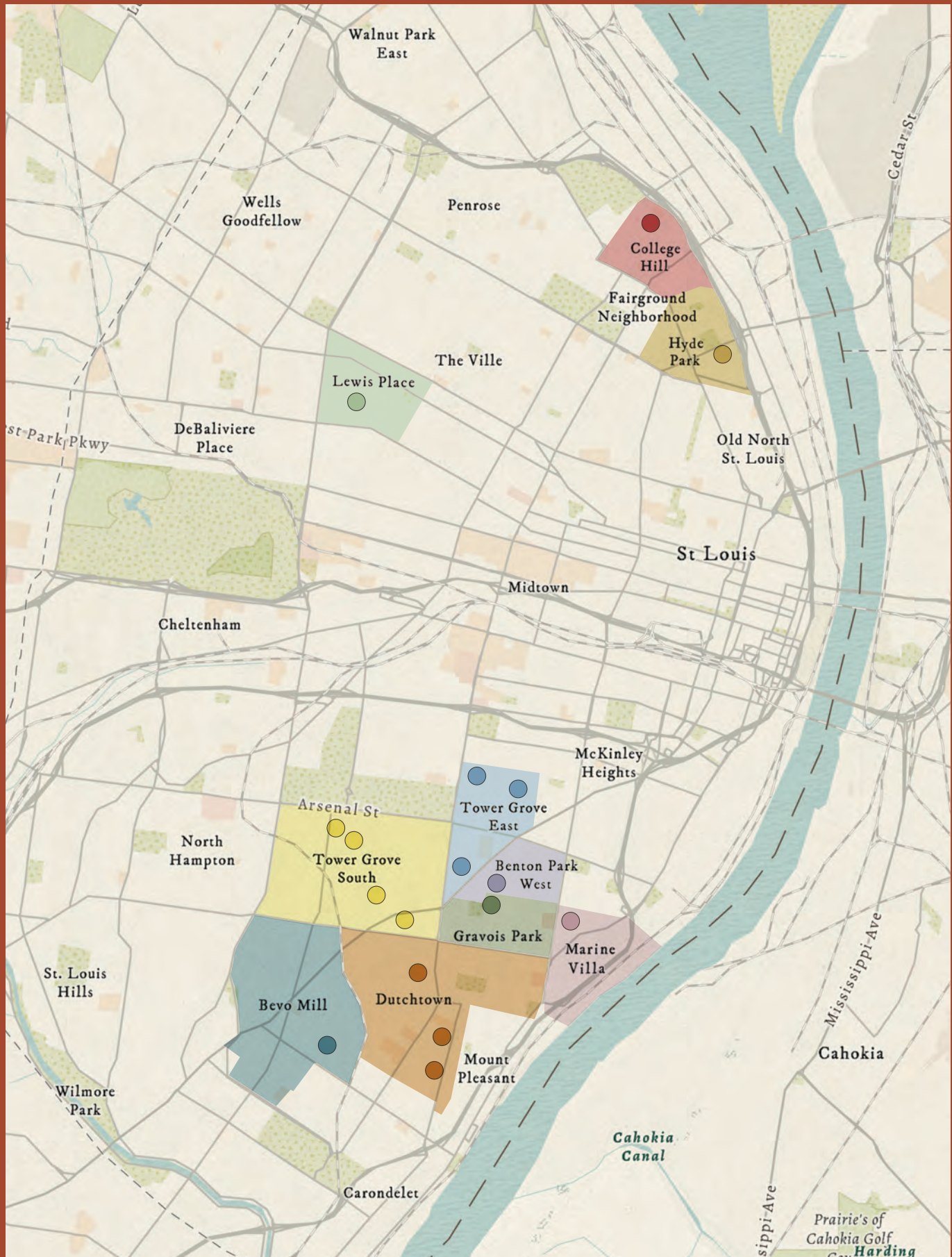

COLLEGE HILL

1500–1502 Linton

In March of 2022, College Hill Foundation (CHF) engaged *Neighborhood Advocacy* for assistance with abating nuisance conditions at 1500–1502 Linton Avenue—a long-blighted property on a high visibility corridor across from a nationally recognized lavender farm.

Neighborhood Advocacy filed a lawsuit on CHF's behalf in the Circuit Court for the City of St. Louis with the Court finding the property to be abandoned and ultimately transferring it into the hands of those willing to invest and put in the work. What took place as a result was a resurrection. College Hill Foundation lovingly and painstakingly restored the property from the brink of collapse to its current glory. The property has been approved for occupancy and ready for new homeowners.

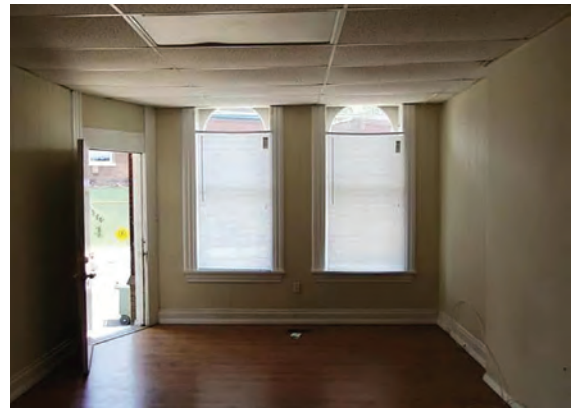
